Kieran Gillingham is Bishopstoke's first Champion

Bishopstoke Parish Council is delighted to announce its first ever Bishopstoke Champion Award to **Kieran Gillingham**. Kieran works for the Environment Agency and has gained a wealth of knowledge about the River Itchen – the river that is such a major feature of Bishopstoke. One of the nominees recently said "Kieran willingly goes over and above his duties, by volunteering as a bailiff on the Itchen Navigation and he has set up The Itchen Navigation Preservation Trust to help protect this wonderful river."

Coronation Big Lunch

As part of the Coronation celebrations in honour of His Majesty, King Charles III, Bishopstoke Carnival organised a Big Lunch and Sports Day on Sunday May 7th. We were joined by almost 100 residents including members of 7th Eastleigh 2nd Fair Oak Beavers group, local families, PCSOs and Bishopstoke Parish Councillors.

Everyone was encouraged to bring their own picnic, and activities included egg and spoon racing, sack racing, croquet, welly wanging, three-legged racing and hook-a-duck! Throughout the afternoon around 100 residents took advantage of the free entertainment and the sunshine. Bishopstoke Parish Council Vice Chair Louise Hillier-Wheal said "It's really gratifying to see so many people enjoying this fantastic free afternoon". We look to holding similar events again.

Bishopstoke Parish Council Grants – Victim Support

The first grant of the new financial year went to Victim Support. £150 was given to purchase security items that are provided free of charge to victims and their families such as personal alarms and small security items for the home. The Council regularly gives grants to Victim Support and was pleased to be able to help again this year.

Parish Assembly

The annual Bishopstoke Parish Assembly took place on Tuesday May 9th. The meeting started with a brief speech from the Acting Chair in the absence of Council Chair Ray Dean, followed by a presentation of the audited accounts.

There then followed an illustrated presentation by Catharine Gale from Hampshire Swifts. Catharine focussed on the plight of swifts in the UK and what we can all do to help them. Swifts are the fastest bird in level flight, travelling at around 69 miles per hour. But their nesting sites are fast disappearing and Hampshire Swifts are encouraging people to install swift birdboxes on their homes.
