Bishopstoke Memorial Hall

The project to provide a new Community Building for Bishopstoke is moving forward! It is planned that the current Hall will be demolished this year and the site cleared. We are looking at several different possibilities for how a new building would serve the people of Bishopstoke and also fit in with the existing buildings and landscape. Once we have plans ready to show people there will be a public consultation to give us an idea of the preferred design for the building.



At the same time as the new building goes up the Parish Council is looking to revamp the rest of Glebe Meadow, in particular by replacing the skate park and making better use of the meadow itself to provide a picnic area in amongst new wildflower planting and trees.

The Borough Council has already promised over £1 million towards the new building, but we will need to get significant other funding to get the building Bishopstoke deserves, and how we go about that will be discussed by the Council in the coming months.

We are looking forward to getting started on Bishopstoke's new building!

Council Funding 2023-24

Bishopstoke Council Tax rises by £1.31 per month for a Band D household.

The Parish Council has now agreed the budget for 2023-24. We have tried to keep costs as low as we can because we know how difficult things are at the moment. However, costs are also rising for the Council in providing the services we do, from play areas to burial grounds and everything in between.

The Council has lowered planned spending on newsletters, overtime, grants and allotments, and reduced the amount being set aside for Glebe Meadow this coming year, which has enabled us to keep our precept rise down to 20% - equivalent to an extra £1.31 per month for a Band D house, and a total of £94.06 for the year.

Two of this year's completed projects






Just over a third of the money that
Bishopstoke Parish Council receives goes
towards paying the staff who run the
cemetery, the allotments, the play areas
and the Council meetings. Another quarter
covers the contract to keep our grass cut
and hedges trimmed.

The rest (about £145,000 this coming year) pays for allotments and cemeteries, play areas and travel tokens, carnival and communications, as well as saving something for the new Memorial Hall.

Where did your 2022-23 Council Tax go?



Council Tax doesn't just fund Bishopstoke Parish Council. The chart above shows the breakdown of where your money went last year, with Hampshire County Council claiming nearly £1,400 for the year, compared to £78 taken by Bishopstoke.

The consultation on what to do with the land at Stoke Park Farm that was purchased by the Borough Council last year is still live. Sewall Drive & Bow Lake Gardens

We continue to monitor the situation with the public spaces at Sewall Drive and Bow Lake Gardens but unfortunately neither are able to be offered to the Parish Council yet. This means both new allotment sites, the new cemetery, the open space at Sewall Drive, the community orchard at Bow Lake Gardens and the play area at Judges Gully are all still either owned by the developers or in the hands of the Borough Council.



We are aware of reports of anti-social behaviour at several of the sites. Please contact the police non-emergency number (101) to report such incidents unless you believe a serious offence has been committed, or there is immediate danger to either people or property – in which case call 999. The more incidents are reported, the more often the police will patrol the area.

We only print on FSC accredited paper from sustainable sources. These are monitored by the Forestry Stewardship Council to ensure sustainability. We don't print on recycled stock which can be harmful to the environment because harmful chemicals and bleaching agents can be used in the recycling process. We use vegetable-based ink instead of chemical ink

Bishopstoke Jubilee War Memorial

As part of the Glebe Meadow project the War Memorial will be moved to a new location, hopefully at Old St Mary's – the old churchyard near the bottom of Church Road opposite Glebe Meadow.

Defibrillators funded by the Parish Council are now in place at Bishopstoke Methodist Church, the Bishopstoke Community Centre and Stokewood Surgery, with two more planned for Underwood Road allotments, and near the Cemetery on Sewall Drive.
